■ Fourth Wall Theatre Company treated Melbourne audiences to intense, thought-provoking theatre in a double bill of Australian plays at \$t Martins Theatre, South Varra

St Martins Theatre, South Yarra.
Inspired by true stories, the first play What is the Matter with Mary Jane? written as a monologue by Wendy Harmer and Sancia Robinson, follows Sancia's story about her life-threatening eating disorder.

Director Natasha Boyd's interpretative script adaptation introduced three females and one male to depict Sancia, her controlling, negative inner voices and others, individually and unified. This treatment enhanced audience interest and emphasised non-gender specific vulnerability to eating disorders.

Casey Bohan, Jen Bush,

Samuel Howard and Isabella Perversi delivered expressive, articulate performances, using a gamut of emotions to skilfully immerse their audience in this torrid story.

Boyd's direction ensured sustained pace and visual interest, with the centre-stage scales and toilet a stark reminder of this mental health disorder's cause and effect.

After interval, Patricia Cornelius's poetically rhythmic, feminist drama Slut commenced with emergency vehicle sirens.

Schoolgirls chant that a man is dead. He was "a good man", a hero killed trying to save "a party girl stripper", who we learn is their childhood friend Lolita.

Slut tells of Lolita's sad life trajectory from happy, top-grade student to tragic downfall.

The fickle, mercurial gossip of friends' sees Lolita revered, envied and loathed as her life spirals uncontrollably from sexual objectification, abuse and violence.

Julia Lambert, Malaynee Hayden, Casey Bohan and Jen Bush presented articulate, high-energy performances under Natasha Boyd's skilled, sensitive direction. Reschelle O'Connor created

compelling and memorable theatre with her outstanding portrayal of Lolita, who desperately craved friendship, love, loyalty and respect.

Natasha Boyd and Chris Collins's effective sound design atmospherically complemented the
